Description

Amazon Products Feed is a free, open source, Perl script designed to make it easy for Associates of Amazon.com to add from one to hundreds of thousands of product listings to their site. Having been in development for many years it has grown to be one of the most feature rich and versatile Amazon Web Services consuming applications available today. While still maintaining an ease of installation that has allowed thousands of webmasters with no Perl experience to install and use.

It is cross platform (developed on both Windows and Linux), multi-lingual (German, Spanish, French, and Japanese are included), customizable (using simple HTML files aspage templates), extensible (through third-party external modules), and safe (the primary developer is an expert in computer security with extensive Internet experience).

Even with all this functionality installing it can be as simple as uploading the files and running it. The script knows the first time it is run and automatically opens up the configuration web page where you can select the options you want, or just accept the

defaults, and create a password. It requires no Perl modules, sure it may use some for efficiency if it finds them, but it will still run just fine without them. It's that simple to use. And remember, it's free; you owe us nothing but thanks.

looking back to the beginning of Amazon WebServices, in a sense i've been with the service from the start, but more as someone trying to learn from it and rather using existing code examples; on the pathway i've gone through a large variety of them; this includes the old StorePerfect example which then won the first award, but disappeared not long after from the scene.

the Amazon Products Feed Script by MrRat has become the most solid replacement of the original store with many more advantages: it is certainly faster than the ASP.net based script, it is very easily integratable into about every website/website-layout (i've played with it on other existing layouts with great success). it is very easy to customize to ones needs, for the advanced user it even allows to add code snippets to it without causing havoc to the major chunk of the working script, and MrRat is surrounded by a wonderful community of serious-minded individuals also contributing their solutions to the script, this whole complexity of arrangements, to me, is comparable to the orchestration of some of the finest music available to humanity, i will probably never find the exact phrasing to use for a script as fine as this.

to top it all: This is the ONLY Open Source Perl solution to Amazon E-Commerce Service i have come across, and i will surely stick to it for a long time to come. i've been using it since 2003, when Amazon E-Commerce Service was still Amazon WebServices, and even then the script had been around for some time.
